Mohammad Rejaul Ansari is from a small village called Bagjoriin Jamtara. He is from a poor backward class family that consists of 6 members (three younger brothers and two younger sisters) including his mother. Mr. Rejaul has lost his father due to some illness. Currently his mother is the only bread winner. She works as a domestic worker with no fixed income. Therefore single handily taking care of all the children and providing all the necessities of life was impossible for her. This forced Mr. Rejaul to discontinue his studies and look out for some job and support his struggling mother.

After discontinuing his studies, he goes around looking for some job and returns empty handed. Since he was fresher with no prior experience and skill, nobody came forward to offer him any job. He was under stress and started worrying about his future.

For his surprise, one day he hears about the community meeting organised by FVTRS in his village to discuss about skill training to the drop out and underprivileged youth. He and his mother attend the meeting. He says
"That particular meeting changed the direction of my life and opened up plentiful livelihood options for me. I enrolled myself for two-wheeler mechanic training and learnt the trade very well within the training period. In addition EDP \& Soft skill training helped him to groom himself and organise his business.

After successful completion of the training I joined a local mechanic shop for a work. Initially I was getting Rs. 3,000 per month. Through gradual experience and increased efficiency, my salary also was increased and currently I am drawing Rs. 20,000 per month. I am very happy about the progress I am witnessing in my life. My mother is overjoyed to see me working and supporting her financially.
